

 - 2 Air Transportable Clinics





SunZia Proposals Affecting IR-133





SunZia Impacts




- **The Sun Zia Power Transmission Lines**
 - **Cuts Through the West Side of IR-133**
- **Current Sun Zia Transmission Line proposal will have a negative impact on IR-133 effectiveness for low-level operations**
- **Three known wind farm projects exacerbate impacts**
- **Sun Zia will bring with it multiple wind companies**
 - **First Wind – Vaughn Project (East side of IR-133)**
 - **Iberdrola – El Cabo Project (North side of IR-133)**
 - **Berrendo – Berrendo Renewables (East Central side of IR-133)**
 - **Possible additional future proposals**



Wind Farm Impacts



- **Wind Farms not just a Physical Encroachment**
 - **Goes Beyond Obstacle Clearance**
 - **TFR must avoid working turbines by 1.5nm**





Impacts to USAF and GAF



- **IR-133 is the only low-level MTR that ends in range airspace (Red Rio Range)**
- **F-16 Formal Training Unit and German Air Force utilize IR-133 524 times per year**
 - **F-16 at 500' AGL**
 - **GAF Tornado at 100' AGL**
- **Possible future Eurofighter operations (Pending December 2013 Decision)**




