

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### **Vet's Home Activities**

- David loves to work on his garden. Every spring he gets seeds, the staff help him prep the soil, and he grows tomatoes, peppers, squash, and other vegetables that the residents share, and staff purchases to help replenish the funds for next year's plants.
- He spends hours and hours outside talking to the plants, and visitors/residents and staff about his gardening. He relays history about his upbringing on a farm with his family in upper state NY.



### **Vets Activities:**







Books are donated by families, friends, local libraries for resident enjoyment and entertainment.


There is a video and music cart by the window for residents to sign out their favorite movies, whenever they choose, 24 hours a day.

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### Progress on Issues Identified in Recent LFC Walk-through

- HVAC system work in progress; voltage within regulatory limits from utility, Outdoor Units (ODU's) have been reset, continue with troubleshooting and resolving issues with Building Automation System (BAS).
- Air circulation in Annex vastly improved by extending vent pipes on the roof, emptying the pool, and plugging the pool drain line on the outside of the building.
- The pool design phase has begun, returning it to a chlorinated pool.
- All exterior work to the Annex building close to completion.

Do functional and operational deficiencies affect the facility (not necessarily addressed by the condition assessment) impacting "Quality of Care"?



The architectural orientation, size, and layout of resident rooms, corridors, nurses' stations, and public spaces at the NMSVH represent an outdated model that does not adhere to design standards for modern long-term care facilities. The functional and operational deficiencies of this obsolete model adversely impact the quality of care that staff can provide to the residents.



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### **Vets Home Green Concept Build**

The Green House Project is a model for long-term care that moves away from the one-size-fits-all philosophy and towards "person-directed care" that emphasizes autonomy, dignity and well-being

The Green House Project differs from traditional long-term care:


- Autonomy: Private bathrooms and rooms, access to shared and social areas at any time
- **Green Living:** In this case, "green" means living within the natural world, such as plenty of sunlight, garden areas, plants and outdoor access
- Intimacy: Community consists of clusters of smaller homes with 6-10 senior residents
- Smart Technology: Green House communities use smart technology such as adaptive devices, computers and ceiling lifts
- Warmth: A warm living situation consists of a layout that encourages social activity, as well as decor and furnishings that provide comfort






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### New Design Build
