





Personnel Assisting at the DHSEM Emergency Operations Center. Over 600 requests for support and assistance from multiple agencies and counties received.



Sandbags made for communities in New Mexico by NMNG personnel.



Over 85 flight hours flown in direct efforts of fire containment



Entities Supported (FEMA, State of NM, DOT, DOH, State Forestry, 13 Counties, State Police, HHS, OMI, SLD)



Sandbags Delivered to counties, critical infrastructure, and locals with disabilities

(Over 100K delivered to the counties from the State Penn).



Military Aviation & Civil Air Patrol Mission Mileage (Tactical, GSA, GSD): 200,373



Local civilians evacuated. Over 600 notified to evacuate residences.



Cubic Feet of Debris removed from roadways and critical infrastructure. Over 8 miles ditched on HWY A94 Over 7 miles ditch on HWY A434 Over 1000 hours of engineering equipment documented.



Gallons of Non-Potable Water delivered to assist with fire containment by NMNG personnel.



Humanitarian Missions Over 4 food banks and the Salvation Army Donation Center

(Over 80 Pallets of Donations Delivered)



Linear feet of HESCOs placed throughout all counties affected by the Wildfires.



Cords of firewood transported by NMNG to multiple locations around 2 different counties. 54 cords of wood delivered to individuals with disabilities and the elderly





NM National Guard Youth ChalleNGe

The New Mexico National Guard has completed 42 Cycles of the Youth Challe NGe Program which began in July 2001.

To date, 3,034 New Mexico youth have graduated from the Program. Cycle 43 is scheduled to graduate on December 16, 2022.

NM National Guard Job Challe NGe


New Mexico Department of Military Affairs will partner with Central New Mexico Community College (CNM) to provide vocational training for in-demand jobs in New Mexico.

Trades under consideration are those not requiring a college degree while offering earning potential and employment stability.

The program will accommodate 50 cadets per cycle and is structured as a flow thru program from NM National Guard Youth ChalleNGe.

Job Challenge is 75% federally funded with a 25% state match.

New Mexico Job Challenge will be held at Expo New Mexico in Albuquerque. Job Challenge students will reside at that site during training.

2022 Legislative Proposal

National Guard Death Benefits Act: Creates a new section in law to provide a one-time \$100,000 death benefit for the survivors of National Guard Soldiers and Airmen, and members of the State Defense force who are killed while on State Active Duty.

State Active Duty - Natural Disaster / Emergency Preparedness: Employ members of the New Mexico National Guard on State Active Duty, as either full-time or seasonal state employees, for purpose of providing preparedness mitigation or response to any type of disaster or emergency.

LEAP Initiative

Scope of issue: A longstanding need to support the recruitment, placement, and retention of New Mexico Military Institute graduates and age-related cohorts into occupations within the State of New Mexico. Law Enforcement (LE), the Department of Corrections (DOC), and the National Guard present compatible opportunities.

Course of Action: Introduce a multi-step agency initiative to create a cadet pathway program from the NMMI graduate population to form a Law Enforcement/Corrections Academic Pathway (LEAP) Program.
