

ECONOMIC IMPACT

• Arts and cultural industry has an estimated economic activity of about \$3 billion, almost 4% of the state's economic activity.


The sector also has a significant positive impact on the tourism, a \$6 billion industry.


• New Mexico ranks 1st nationally for the number of fine artists per 10,000 people; Santa Fe and Albuquerque rank 1st and 2nd among US metropolitan areas in the density of visual artists.

(Creative Vitality Index)

- Arts and cultural industries in New Mexico employ 21,243 individuals. (US Bureau of Economic Analysis)
- In FY 22, admission to DCA facilities generated \$2.8 million in revenue with 636,177 visitors.

DCA FACILITIES

- Managed by DCA, not GSD
- 191 structures, 100 of which are on a state and/or federal historic registry
- 1.3 million square feet
- Over a 1,000 acres
- Eight museums/cultural center (Alamogordo, Albuquerque, Las Cruces & Santa Fe)
- Eight historic sites (Jemez, Bernalillo, Ft. Sumner, Radium Springs, Mesilla, Lincoln, Ft. Stanton & Acalde)
- Center for NM Archaeology & Stewart L. Udall Center for Museum Resources (Santa Fe)
- Specialized facilities
- Facilities & collections valued at \$1 billion (RMD 2017)

FACILITIES FUNDING

- \$53.6 million in projects over next 5 yrs.; \$19.6 in 2024
- \$5 million American Rescue Plan—facilities/infrastructure outside Santa Fe county (FY23 appropriation)
- \$5 million Cultural Affairs Facilities Infrastructure Fund (NMFA PPRF) (FY23 appropriation)
- \$6.7 million in statewide & individual capital outlay (FY23 appropriation)



CAFIF

- Created in 2020
- Managed by DCA for the costs of repairing, renovating, planning, engineering, equipping, and furnishing facilities and exhibits
- Fund has received three appropriations from Public Project Revolving Loan Fund (PPRF), totaling \$15 million
- Critical source of funding; without the fund, no recurring, stable source of repair and maintenance funding

FUNDED PROJECTS

88% of FY22 funds have been spent or encumbered.

- \$11,000 to replace electrical breaker @ Los Luceros Historic Site, Acalde
- \$250,000 for historic wood restoration @ National Hispanic Cultural Center, Albuquerque
- \$375,000 for water service line @ NM Museum of Space History, Alamogordo
- \$30,000 for fire system upgrades @ Ft. Stanton Historic Site
- \$25,000 metal shop repairs @ Bosque Redondo Memorial/Ft. Sumner Historic Site
- \$150,000 for door and restroom repairs @ NM Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum, Las Cruces
- \$168,000 for ADA upgrades @ Taylor-Mesilla Historic Property, Mesilla
- \$200,000 for HVAC repairs at the Center for NM Archaeology, Santa Fe
- \$350,000 for stucco and window repairs, Stewart L. Udall Center for Museum Resources, Santa Fe
