#### General Overview

- Settlement Agreements signed January 22, 2016
  - Based on the April 30, 2015 Principles of Agreement
  - Identifies corrective actions and designate compliance schedules
  - Specifies Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEPs)
  - NMED has enforcement capability for non-compliance
- Parties for WIPP:
  - New Mexico Environment Department (NMED)
  - Department of Energy- Carlsbad Field Office (DOE CBFO)
  - Nuclear Waste Partnership (NWP)
- Parties for LANL:
  - NMED
  - DOE National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA)
  - Los Alamos National Security, LLC (LANS)




## General Overview (Cont'd)

- SEPs for both agreements total \$74 Million
- Each SEP has an assigned team
  - Team is made up of staff from DOE, Contractors, NMED and outside stakeholders (where appropriate)
  - Each team has a NMED team leader
    - Responsible for coordinating meetings, focusing discussions & has final decision-making authority



#### State of New Mexico/US Dept. of Energy: \$74M Supplemental Environmental Projects

New Mexico Roads - Carlsbad Area \$34.0
Emergency Operations Center - Carlsbad\$4.6
Emergency Responder Training - Carlsbad\$1.0
New Mexico Roads - Los Alamos Area\$12.0
Potable Water Line Replacements - LANL\$10.0
Canyon Storm Water Controls - Los Alamos Area\$7.5
Storm Water, Increased Sampling/Monitoring - Los Alamos Area\$2.5
External Triennial Compliance Reviews - LANL & WIPP\$3.0



#### Current Status- WIPP

- □ Roads \$34M
  - First phase of North Access Road improvements complete (~\$910K)
  - Next phase of work to begin mid-August
- Emergency Operations Center \$4M
  - Ribbon-cutting event April 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Awaiting back-up generator installation to complete SEP
    - Estimated to complete in September



## Current Status- WIPP (Cont'd)

- Emergency Responder Training \$1M
  - SEP is complete NMED issued certification of completion on June 24, 2016
- □ Triennial Review \$500K
  - Team has had several meetings
  - Working to finalize scope and determine acquisition strategy
  - Triennial Review Scope of Work due to NMED by January 22, 2017
    - First review must be completed by September 30, 2018

#### Current Status-Los Alamos

- Roads \$12M
  - Determined projects to be executed
  - Working on acquisition strategy
    - Want most money to go to projects, not overhead costs
  - Written document (Addendum 1)
    - Will include agreed upon dates, deadlines and projects
- □ Watershed enhancement (engineered structures) \$7.5M
  - Close to determining projects to be executed
    - Final decisions will depend on cost of work execution
  - LANS will be contractor tasked with execution
  - □ Currently developing the Storm Water Engineering Structure MEX Work Plan (Addendum 2)

## Current Status-Los Alamos (Cont'd)

- Surface water sampling \$2.5M
  - Close to determining projects to be executed
    - Final decisions will depend on cost of work execution
  - LANS will be contractor tasked with execution
  - Currently developing the Supplemental Sampling and Monitoring Work Plan (Addendum 3)
- Water line replacement \$10M
  - Identified scope of work
  - Working on acquisition strategy
  - Developing work plan (Addendum 4)
    - Will include project scope and estimated costs
- Triennial Review \$2.5M
  - Team has had several meetings
  - Working to finalize scope and determine acquisition strategy
  - Triennial Review Scope of Work due to NMED by January 22, 2017
    - First Triennial Review must be conducted by September 30, 2018

## Summary

- SEP teams are working collaboratively
  - Inclusion of outside stakeholders
  - Some teams meet bi-weekly, some monthly
- Beginning to narrow scope and develop work plans/addendums for remaining SEPs
- All SEPs on track to be completed on schedule
