








Funding and Staffing

Multiple years of flat budgets, sweeping of revenues, and declining federal funds broke the mission and staff. NMED is now building capacity and making up for lost time.

Air quality permitting grew by 256% from 2008 to 2018 without any staff increases.

Four engineers directly or indirectly oversee 380 water infrastructure projects totaling \$265.8 million dollars.



95% of the largest hazardous waste generators in the State are not inspected annually due to funding limitations.



Our 11 drinking water staff are responsible for oversight and compliance at 1,100 treatment plants throughout the state.



Our 22 food personnel oversee 9,200 commercial food establishments across the state to ensure proper food handling/sanitation and conduct food borne illness investigations.
