Current budget allows the Commission to test a combination of equine urine/blood samples. In FY11, the Commission was allowed 13,044 samples to be tested, for an average of 45.1 daily tests. This does not include out of competition or necropsy testing.

## Investigations and Enforcement Statutory Authority: 60-1A-3, 60-1A-5, 60-1A-27, 60-1A-28

Investigations and Enforcement is to ensure rules and regulations are enforced and applied equally to all participants and to provide a standard of proficiency, professionalism and integrity.

### CONCERN: is lack of investigative staff, investigators have become reactive, and productivity is down.

GOAL: to hire three more certified law enforcement investigators, with sufficient staff we can become proactive and address the drug infractions that seem to be plaguing the industry.

### Licensing

Statutory Authority: 60-1A-4, 60-1A-5, 60-1A-6, 60-1A-7, 60-1A-10, 60-1A-11

Licensing is to ensure the utmost of integrity is maintained by allowing only those persons to participate in the industry who meet the qualifications established by state statutes,

## 2012

 During the fiscal year, the system processed over 6,000 new licenses for a total of over 9,000 industry licensed personnel in New Mexico. Licenses are issued for sixty six different categories from Owner to Veterinarian, covering all aspects of horse racing. Hundreds of inquiries to the system are made weekly. **CONCERN:** the program is outdated and obsolete.

GOAL: to obtain license database with the technology that is user friendly, gives instant access to individual licensee records, main office and field office communication, and ensure the highest quality of security.

### **Race Meet Oversight**

Statutory Authority: 60-1A-11 (C), 60-1A-12

Race Meet Oversight is to have a representative of the Racing Commission at each race meeting to require strict observance of the rules and regulations, thus ensuring the integrity of racing in the state. **CONCERN:** is the access to a more streamline way of communication with other jurisdictions to ensure racing participants are in good standing.

## Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances and Recommended Penalties and Model Rule

## Version 3.00 Revised December 2011

### **Preamble to the Uniform Classification Guidelines of Foreign Substances**

- The Uniform Classification Guidelines are intended to assist stewards, hearing officers and racing commissioners in evaluating the seriousness of alleged violations of medication and prohibited substance rules in racing jurisdictions...
- The ranking of drugs is based on their pharmacology, their ability to influence the outcome of a race, whether or not they have legitimate therapeutic uses in the racing horse, or other evidence that they may be used improperly.

## **Definitions of Classifications**

#### CLASSIFICATION

#### **ARCI DEFINITION**

#### CLASS 1

- Stimulant and depressant drugs that have the highest potential to affect performance and that have no generally accepted medical use in the racing horse
- CLASS 2
- Drugs that have a high potential to affect performance, but less than Class 1. These drugs are 1)not generally accepted as therapeutic agents in racing horses, or 2) they are therapeutic agents that have a high potential for abuse.

#### CLASS 3

Drugs that may or may not have generally accepted medical use in the racing horses, but the pharmacology of which suggest less potential to affect performance e than drugs in Class 2.

#### CLASS 4

This class includes therapeutic medications that would be expected to have less potential to affect performance than those in Class 3.

#### CLASS 5

This class includes those therapeutic medications for which concentration limits have been established by the racing jurisdictions as well as certain miscellaneous agents and other medications as determined by the regulatory bodies.

### THE NEW MEXICO RACING COMMISSION PRIVIOUS PENALIZES BY THE DRUG CLASSIFICATION, I.E., CLASS 1, CLASS 2, CLASS 3, ETC. (as cited in 15.2.6 NMAC)

- 15.2.6.9 B. *PENALTY RECOMMENDATIONS* (in the absence of mitigating circumstances).
- (1) Class 1 one to five years' suspension and at least \$5,000 fine and loss of purse.
- (2) Class 2 six months to one-year suspension and \$1,500 to \$2,500 fine and loss of purse.
- (3) Class 3 sixty days to six months suspension and up to \$1,500 fine and loss of purse.
- (4) Class 4 fifteen to 60 days suspension and up to \$1,000 fine and loss of purse.
- (5) Class 5 zero to 15 days suspension with a possible loss of purse and/or fine.

## CATEGORY "A" VIOLATION

- (1) Category A penalties will be assessed against a trainer for violations due to the presence of a drug carrying a category A penalty. Recommended penalties for category A violations for a licensed trainer are as follows.
- (a) First offense shall be a minimum one-year suspension to a maximum three-year suspension, a fine of \$10,000 or 10% of total purse (greater of the two) and may be referred to the commission for any further action deemed necessary by the commission.
- (b) Second lifetime offense in any jurisdiction shall be a minimum three-year suspension with a maximum license revocation with no reapplication for a three-year period, a fine of \$10,000 or 25% of total purse (greater of the two), and may be referred to the commission for further action deemed necessary by the commission.
- (c) Third lifetime offense in any jurisdiction shall be a minimum five-year suspension with a maximum of license revocation with no reapplication for a five-year period, a fine of \$10,000 or 50% of the purse (whichever of the two is greater), and may be referred to the commission for any further action deemed necessary by the commission.
- (2) Category A penalties will be assessed against an owner for violations due to the presence of a drug carrying a category A penalty. Recommended penalties for category A violations for a licensed owner are as follows.
- (a) First offense shall be disqualification, loss of purse and horse shall be placed on the veterinarian's list for 90 days and must pass a commission-approved examination before becoming eligible to be entered.
- (b) Second lifetime offense in owner's stable in any jurisdiction shall be disqualification, loss of purse and horse shall be placed on the veterinarian's list for 120 days and must pass a commission-approved examination before becoming eligible to be entered.
- (c) Third lifetime offense in owner's stable in any jurisdiction shall be disqualification, loss of purse, \$10,000 fine, horse shall be placed on the veterinarian's list for 180 days and must pass a commission-approved examination before becoming eligible to be entered, and referral to the commission with a recommendation of a suspension for a minimum of 90 days.
