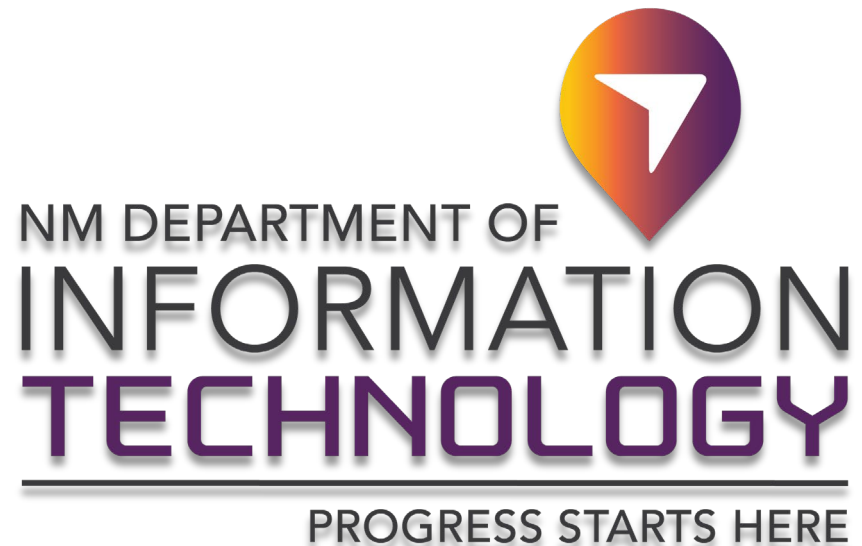

# 2021 BROADBAND LEGISLATION UPDATES

## House Bill 10: Connect New Mexico Act (Laws 2021, Chapter 120)

- ▼ Created the Connect New Mexico Council
  - ▼ 15 members have been appointed
  - ▼ Inaugural meeting is pending
- ▼ Created the Connect New Mexico Fund
  - ▼ Senate Bill 377 appropriated \$100 million (Detail shown on Slide 7)

# 2021 BROADBAND LEGISLATION UPDATES

## Senate Bill 93: Broadband Access and Expansion Act (Laws 2021, Chapter 123)

- Created the Office of Broadband Access and Expansion (OBAE)
  - Administratively attached to the Department of Information Technology (DoIT)
  - DoIT established a program code for the OBAE's budget and submitted its FY23 Budget Request to the Legislative Finance Committee and Department of Finance and Administration
- Office managed by a director appointed by the Governor
  - Governor appointed Matt Schmit as an advisor to the OBAE

# 2021 BROADBAND LEGISLATION FUNDING

**Senate Bill 377: Broadband Appropriations - \$100M\*** (Laws 2021, Chapter 140, Section 17)

- Appropriated to the Connect New Mexico Fund\*\* (FY2021-FY2026)
  - Plan, design, engineer, construct, and purchase and equip broadband infrastructure (\$70M)
  - Grants to local governments, tribes, electric and telephone cooperatives for planning and grant writing (\$5M)
  - Plan, design, engineer, construct, purchase and equip broadband infrastructure for public schools (\$25M) – from Public School Reform Fund

\*Contingency language limits the amount to be spent until DoIT/OBAE submits an expenditure plan

\*\* Connect New Mexico Council (HB10) is responsible for evaluating and prioritizing grant proposals and making grant awards from the Connect New Mexico Fund

# 2021 BROADBAND LEGISLATION FUNDING

**House Bill 285: Capital Outlay Broadband Appropriations - \$7.05M\*** (Laws 2021, Chapter 138, Section 26)

- Appropriated to DoIT to plan, design, engineer, construct, and purchase and equip broadband infrastructure

\*Contingency language limits the amount to be spent until DoIT submits an expenditure plan



# FEDERAL FUNDING SUPPORT

## Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

- Internet Service Provider subscription and device support
  - 54,220 statewide recipients (includes all eligible households – not just students)
  - May result in over \$32.5M in support

## Emergency Connect Fund

- Broadband Connectivity and Devices to the Home
  - Total funding requests \$67.5M
  - Student with devices 106K
  - Students with broadband connections 41.2K

## E-Rate Libraries

- E-Rate Funding of \$2M leveraged with \$300K of State Funds
  - Over 80 percent of libraries connected to fiber at over 100Mbps or greater
  - Over 80 percent of tribal libraries are connected
  - Three bookmobiles equipped with mobile satellite service
  - E-Rate participation increased 45 percent since 2017 (Consultant/E-Rate Coordinator)

# 2021 BROADBAND PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

## New Mexico Technical Assistance Program (NM TAP)

- Established as a result of a \$1.5 million Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant (October 2020)
  - Provide technical assistance to entities seeking to deploy or expand broadband infrastructure and services
  - Applications based on a Request for Information (RFI)
- Types of Support Services
  - Needs Assessment to evaluate current and future demand for broadband
  - Assess recipient communities' current broadband infrastructure and market
  - Prepare high-level design and cost estimate for broadband deployment
  - Evaluate funding options and develop strategic approaches to obtain needed funding
- Recognized regionally and nationally by EDA

# 2021 BROADBAND PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

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## New Mexico Technical Assistance Program

- ▼ Responses from RFI
  - ▼ Ten responses received
  - ▼ Evaluation of responses underway
  - ▼ Assessing resources, scheduling requirements, and engaging each for clarification
  - ▼ Anticipate addressing all ten
  - ▼ Good spread geographically, some coinciding with the June 2020 Strategic Plan project areas
    - ▼ Northern NM/Abiquiu, Ski Santa Fe, Rural North of Taos, East Mountain, Socorro, Sierra County, Silver City, Eastern New Mexico, SW New Mexico, and Deming

# 2021 BROADBAND PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

## New Mexico Technical Assistance Program

- Webinars - DoIT hosted a series of webinars in mid-September and November for stakeholders and internet service providers
  - Highlighted general federal offers, USDA ReConnect Program, and a NM TAP RFI overview
  - Highly successful participation (exceeding 250 participants)
  - Appreciation in simplifying complicated funding requirements

# 2021 BROADBAND PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

## Community Broadband Survey

- Pilot Doña Ana County in partnership with Doña Ana County Broadband Committee
  - Nearly 3,500 respondents to date
  - Identify unserved areas in the County
  - Assist in the implementation of digital literacy programs in the County
  - Survey includes a Speed Test
  - Analysis on-going
- Contract amendment underway to expand the survey instrument and analytics in other communities interested in partnering with the program

# 2021 BROADBAND PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

## Statewide Price Agreements

- In response to a request for proposals, DoIT awarded statewide price agreements (SWPA) (August 2021)
  - Planning (six vendors)
  - Grant writing (two vendors)
  - Broadband infrastructure services (three vendors)
- SWPA's are available to all public and tribal agencies to accelerate procurement process for broadband initiatives

# 2021 BROADBAND PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

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## Broadband Infrastructure Plan Project

- ▼ DoIT awarded a contract to develop an operational plan to meet legislative requirements
  - ▼ Initially contractor benchmarked seven other similar states
    - ▼ Governance roles and responsibilities
    - ▼ Funding opportunities
    - ▼ Grant award methodologies
- ▼ Draft deliverables include
  - ▼ Broadband implementation project plan operating model
  - ▼ Proposed governance structure including roles and responsibilities
  - ▼ Prioritized broadband markets and build plan based on the June 2020 New Mexico Broadband Strategic Plan and Rural Broadband Assessment
  - ▼ Proposed spending plan for a list of potential projects
- ▼ Final deliverables are pending the OBAE Advisor review and approval
