






# Aviation in New Mexico

- Important part of the State's transportation infrastructure:
  - Critical services – Medevac, Firefighting, Law Enforcement
  - Business
  - Commercial
  - Tourism
  - Air Cargo
  - Military Training
  - Leisure and Recreational





# New Mexico State Aviation Division

- Coordinates state and federal grants for improving the aviation infrastructure
- Provides planning and technical support in developing and maintaining the State's airports and other elements of the aviation system
- Conducts pilot seminars dealing with safety issues
- Perform regulatory and compliance inspections
- Responsible for the registration of all aircraft based in New Mexico and for the licensing of aircraft dealers.



# Aviation Division Funding

- Aviation Fund is a non-reverting fund
- Revenue streams as follows:
  - 4.79% GRT on Jet Fuel
  - 0.026% Gas Tax
  - 0.046% GRT (Air Service Assistance Program. Sunset June 2018)
  - General Fund Enhancement
  - Aircraft Registrations




# Distribution of Aviation Fund

- State Match to Federal Projects
- Air Service Assistance Program Grants
- State Only Grants for Capital Improvement Projects
- Aviation Division salaries, operations and administration
- Maintenance of two State-Owned airports (Conchas Lake and Navajo Lake)



# Airport System Plan

- A Planning study that is updated approximately every five years to evaluate what is needed to maintain and enhance the State's airport system.
- Goals of the System Plan
  - Increase/Enhance Safety and Security
  - Preserve/Protect the Investment in Airports
  - Accommodate Existing and Projected Demand
  - Support Economic Growth of the Community
- Provides information for governmental and other entities concerning the value, use and need of the State system of airports.



# FY 2015 Funding

- Federal Aviation Administration has programmed over \$15 Million for Airport Improvement Program Grants in New Mexico for FY 15
- Aviation Division has issued over \$ 10.3 million dollars in state grants for infrastructure improvements and planning for FY 15
