- Construct an office building that will adequately address Department of Finance and Administration's housing needs
- Planning Team:

 - Department of Finance & Administration
 - Wilson & Company Architects & Engineers


Programming Results

- 56,000 GSF building, 3 stories in height
- Located at site adjacent to Capitol Parking Structure
 - Requires removal of casitas
- City-approved building height study permits up to 57 feet (4 to 5 stories)

Programming Results

- Project must comply with Law of 2009, Chapter 23, Application of Historical District and Landmark Act to Capital Outlay Projects
- Project complies with the Capitol Buildings Planning Commission Master Plan for the Santa Fe Area dated June 2011

Next Steps

- Seek approval for the project from the Santa Fe Historic Review Board
- Hold Public Meetings
- Issue Design-Build RFP
 - RFP may need to be modified if EOB occupants are changed

Law of 2009, Chapter 23

Application of Historical District and Landmark Act to Capital Outlay Projects

- Establishes a procedure to preserve and protect the historic districts of New Mexico.
- Ordinances enacted by municipality or county shall apply to State Capital Outlay Project.
- State shall work with local government to arrive at a compatible design considering costs and preserving essential functionality.
- State shall transmit plans for review and comment to municipality.

Law of 2009, Chapter 23

Application of Historical District and Landmark Act to Capital Outlay Projects

- Conduct a public meeting to receive public input.
- Within 60 days, recommendation and comments submitted to State in writing.
- If issues remain unresolved, a state-local government historic review board will be formed consisting of 8 members.
- Within 20 days of historic review board formation, a final decision is made.
- Appeals from the decisions of the state-local government historic review board shall be taken to the district court.
