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## New Mexico Health Equity Partnership Activities

### HEALTH COUNCILS & COMMUNITY

- 1) In partnership with the New Mexico Alliance of Health Councils, conduct outreach for and convene one statewide and 5 regional gatherings focused on health equity annually (Years 1-3).
- 2) Incorporate HIA and Place Matters approaches into the Health Councils and Community statewide and regional gatherings (Years 1-3).
- 3) In partnership with the New Mexico Alliance of Health Councils, engage health councils and community partners in HIA trainings and Place Matters efforts (Years 1-3).
- 4) In collaboration with the New Mexico Alliance of Health Councils, share knowledge and best practices, and disseminate resource information in support of health councils' health equity work (Years 1-3).
- 5) In collaboration with the New Mexico Alliance of Health Councils, assist health councils and communities to identify shared policy priorities for advancing health equity and collaborate with other organizations to advocate for shared priorities (Years 2-3).
- 6) In partnership with the New Mexico Alliance of Health Councils, explore funding opportunities related to health equity and disseminate information to health councils and community groups (Years 2-3).

### PLACE MATTERS

- 1) Identify community leaders in San Juan, Doña Ana, and McKinley counties, conduct outreach and support members to assemble diverse, multi-sectorial PLACE MATTERS teams (Year 1).
- 2) Conduct outreach for & coordinate a PLACE MATTERS Orientation with the Joint Center – Health Policy Institute (JC) and Common Health Action (CHA) (Year 1).
- 3) Along with JC, CHA and local PLACE MATTERS teams, participate in regular technical assistance calls (Years 1-3).
- 4) Plan and conduct one site visit with NM PLACE MATTERS teams annually, with JC and CHA (Years 1-3);.
- 5). Coordinate and facilitate two statewide PLACE MATTERS gatherings annually with JC, CHA and PLACE MATTERS Coordinators (1 gathering per year will focus 1 day on HIA) (Years 2-3).
- 6). Coordinate the invitation lists for 2 PLACE MATTERS Action Labs and 1 National Conference annually with local PLACE MATTERS Coordinators (Years 1-3).
- 7). Establish and convene quarterly mtgs. for PLACE MATTERS Advisory Group to strategically align the four New Mexico PLACE MATTERS teams (Years 2 – 3).

### HEALTH IMPACT ASSESSMENT

- 1) In collaboration with Human Impact Partners, develop a system to identify HIA projects; conduct community outreach; screen HIA applications; and select 2 HIA projects in each NMDOH region (10 total) (Years 1-3).
- 2) In collaboration with Human Impact Partners, conduct outreach for and deliver 5 HIA trainings (one in each of the five NMDOH regions) (Years 1 -2).
- 3) In partnership with Human Impact Partners, participate in HIA technical assistance calls and work with two teams in each NMDOH region to conduct and accomplish all stages of the HIA process (Years 1-3).
- 4) Coordinate opportunities for peer-to-peer HIA learning at Health Council & Community and Place Matters gatherings (Years 1 – 3).
- 5) Conduct outreach for & participate in technical assistance calls for 3 HIAs conducted by HIP (Years 1-3).
