



Grant County Fact Sheet

The Community Health Profile highlights important health issues facing the residents of Grant County, New Mexico. The data presented in this fact sheet is a subset of the data collected through the 2012 Community Assessment survey, "Your Home, Your Voice!".

Grant County Demographics

There were 5,055 respondents to the 2012 Community Assessment survey. Age demographics for Grant

The ethnicity of participants was 53.7% Caucasian, 41.2% Hispanic, 3% Native American, and 2.3% African American. Of the participants, 13% (n=642) were Veterans. In regards to highest completed level of education of our participants, 4% had a grade school education, 39% had a high school diploma or GED, 20% had some trade school education or associate degree, and 37% of participants had a bachelor's degree or higher, with 19% having a graduate/advanced degree. About 64% of the participants stated that they lived in Silver City, with the other 36% coming from surrounding communities in Grant County. Participants' annual income ranged from under \$10,000 to over \$90,000, with over 46% of individuals making less than \$30,000 per year. Over 78% of participants reported that they are supporting 3 or fewer individuals on their income, with two individuals being the highest response, at 39%. About 69% stated that they owned their home, with almost 29% saying that they rent. The other 3% had another living arrangement. Almost 22% of participants responded that their home indeed is in need of major repairs for their comfort or safety.




Figure 1. Grant County Community and Social Health (Adults).




Figure 2. Grant County Community and Social Health (Children/Teens).

Among the top seven responses by Grant County residents is shown in Figure 2.




Figure 3. Grant County Environmental Health.




Figure 4. Grant County Economic Health.

The top seven concerns identified by Grant County residents (Figure 4).




Figure 5. Grant County Access to Health Services.

Listed are the top seven concerns identified by Grant County residents (Figure 5).
