Sample Participant Comments Regarding NALTI (2009):

- ❖ *Many tribal communities are in need of training services to help prepare their community members to teach language. For many communities, having to teach our language has become necessary because we are finding that some younger tribal members are unable to speak their tribal language.*
- ❖ *Some NM tribes have started language programs in their communities and others are just beginning. No matter where each tribe is at, there is a great need for a training center here because there is no other university in New Mexico who is doing this.*
- ❖ *This one week institute at UNM is an example of how the university can be of service to tribes in the future. We need summer training programs and workshops for Native speakers. We also need to come together to learn from each other through language conferences such as the one we are having this coming week-end here at UNM.*
- ❖ *This summer's institute is for a short time, but it is close to home and it is staffed by Native Americans who can assist tribes and prepare tribal members to plan their own language programs and certify their own language teachers.*
- ❖ *We need to have the UNM College of Education partner with tribes to seek financial support for a language teacher training center soon.*
