# Significant Issues

According to NMIMT, this bill provides funds to support a potential U.S. Department of Energy grant, the focus of which is to research approaches to increase information systems network security and counter computer hackers.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$200.0 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY01 shall revert to the general fund.
