# Synopsis of Bill

This bill amends the lottery tuition scholarship program modifying the current law by providing that students who begin a specified term of religious missionary service or complete service with the U.S. armed forces are eligible for the award.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The CHE cautions when adding additional groups of students to the program because, given the projected
