FISCAL IMPLICATIONS	

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The bill appropriates \$2,000.0 from the general fund to SDE for expenditure in fiscal years 2000 through 2005. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2005 shall revert to the general fund.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The bill requires that SDE provide the staff needed to implement the provisions of the Bill. The effort needed to implement the provisions of the bill could hamper the SDE's ability to carry out its other statutory duties.

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- the SBE review, approve and adopt the teacher incentive pay pilot projects,
- the PEC appointed by the SBE consist of:

fifteen (15) practicing teachers representative of the various grade levels and the state's geographic and ethnic makeup,

at least one-third of the professional educators will be certified by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, and

two members selected jointly be the New Mexico National Education Association and the New Mexico Federation of Teachers.

The PEC's duties are enumerated in the bill and include:

- developing criteria for selection of the incentive pay pilot project that include benchmarks and outcomes to be achieved,
- using an application process that will allow not more than thirty schools to participate as pilot project sites with elementary school, middle schools, high schools and charter schools deemed eligible to apply to become pilot project schools if seventy-five percent of the teachers agree to become a pilot school.
- designing a teacher incentive pay pilot project that rewards teachers for student achievement and
 includes peer assessment, assessment and accountability measures and a professional development
 framework contributes to the successful implementation of the pilot project.
- providing recommendations to the SBE on teacher development plans.

Responsibilities assigned to SDE area:

- provide staff for the PEC,
- provide professional development and assistance to participating schools for the implementation and operation of the pilot project, and report annually to the Legislature and the Governor on the pilot

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project, including evaluation of the project and recommendations, and

• submit a final report, including any recommendations for proposed legislation by November 2005.
