Also, the memorial requires the engineer to provide examples of domestic wells used for fisheries, aesthetic

or other purposes inconsistent with the intent of Section 72-12-1 NMSA 1978. Additionally, the engineer is charged with providing proposed regulations related to capping and/or plugging of abandoned wells.

Significant Issues

HB 23 calls for the State Engineer to evaluate domestic wells as they currently exist, including accumulated impacts to stream systems

FISCAL / ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

OSE reported minimal impact in the form of some additional study and research. However, most of the data should be obtainable from existing agency files.

CONFLICT/DUPLICATION/COMPANIONSHIP/RELATIONSHIP

HM 23 duplicates HJM 74/aHAGC and relates to SJM 60.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

According to the agency, HM 23 makes the assumption that the engineer is aware of all illegal uses of domestic wells, which is not the case. Consequently, OSE contends that it could prepare a high level report Master FIR (1988) Page 3 of 3

as mandated by the memorial; however, it would show a generalized, rather than specified, representation of the impact of domestic wells in certain critical basins.
