Significant Issues The national association of fish and wildlife agencies created the Wildlife Violator Compact to address a serious problem in game management, i.e., the lack of communication between states on illegal hunting. Ten states have joined the compact, including all of New Mexico's neighboring states with the exception of Texas. The compact establishes policies and procedures enabling states to share information on licensees who have had their licenses revoked in other states for wildlife crimes. MFV/gm
