A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE LABOR DEPARTMENT TO NAME THE LABOR DEPARTMENT BUILDING IN LAS VEGAS, NEW MEXICO IN HONOR OF ELOY LUDI IN RECOGNITION OF HIS FORTY-THREE YEARS OF OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO THE LABOR DEPARTMENT AND TO THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, Eloy Ludi performed many outstanding services and was dedicated to the labor department as area director for the counties of San Miguel, Mora and Guadalupe; and

WHEREAS, the mayor of the city of Las Vegas, the Las Vegas chamber of commerce and the leading newspaper, the Las Vegas Optic, have all unanimously endorsed the idea of this memorial for Eloy Ludi; and

WHEREAS, Eloy Ludi was solely responsible for the dynamic leadership in securing Kearney park from the city of Las Vegas to be able to build the first state-owned labor department building in New Mexico; and
