SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 664 appropriates \$200.0 from the general fund to SAOA to provide training for paid or unpaid health caregivers.

Significant Issues

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$200.0 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY02 shall revert to the general fund.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

The bill does not specify if the health caregivers would specifically provide services to elderly, low-income persons. Also, the type of training could be specified.
