2 WHEREAS, large areas of the Navajo Nation in New Mexico do  
3 not have electricity extended to remote homes, and there is no  
4 telephone service, running water or indoor plumbing in those  
5 homes; and

6 WHEREAS, computers can bridge distance gaps and bring a  
7 distant and foreign world into a person's home, wherever that  
8 person may live, but only if there is the infrastructure to  
9 facilitate access to the required technology; and

10 WHEREAS, commercial possibilities through the internet and  
11 email are limited only by a person's imagination or their  
12 access to technology; and

13 WHEREAS, communication for emergency management and  
14 medical services can occur quickly if the infrastructure is in  
15 place, allowing people located in remote locations to  
16 communicate or receive information quickly over long distances;

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE  
18 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the chief information officer, the  
19 state librarian and the secretary of public safety work with  
20 tribal governments and tribal agencies to assure that  
21 information technology infrastructure is made available to  
22 every person in every tribal community in New Mexico; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no person in the state of New  
24 Mexico shall be left behind in the information age, and that no  
25 part of the state shall remain incapable of accessing
