16	Section 1. Section 21-2A-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995,
17	Chapter 224, Section 17) is amended to read:
18	"21-2A-11. EXTENDED LEARNING PROGRAMSPURPOSE
19	COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION RESPONSIBILITIES REPORTING
20	A. The commission on higher education shall
21	coordinate the role and participation of public post-secondary
22	higher education institutions in the development and operation
23	of extended learning programs. Extended learning programs
24	shall be established to ensure equitable student access to
25	educational opportunities throughout the state. The
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commission shall work to ensure access, efficiency,
 coordination and accountability in the development and
 operation of the extended learning programs.

B. In coordinating the development and operation
of extended learning programs, the commission on higher
education shall make awards from the [extended learning]
higher education technology fund for the purpose of
establishing [pilot] extended learning programs. [Pilot]
Programs shall focus on the creation and operation of
community-based extended learning centers, the development of
regional resources and the expanded use of technology in
instruction.

C. Annually, prior to October 1, the commission on higher education shall report to the legislature and the governor on the status of extended learning programs and make recommendations on the funding level for such projects for the upcoming year."

Section 2. Section 21-2A-12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 224, Section 18) is amended to read:

"21-2A-12. [EXTENDED LEARNING] <u>HIGHER EDUCATION</u> <u>TECHNOLOGY</u> FUND CREATED--DISTRIBUTION OF FUND.--The "[extended learning] <u>higher education technology</u> fund" is created in the state treasury. Money in the fund is appropriated to the commission on higher education for the purpose of making awards to public schools and public post-secondary

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1 institutions for the purpose of developing and operating extended learning programs and information technology projects 2 throughout the state. The commission shall establish by 3 4 regulation a procedure for application and award of money in Disbursements of the fund shall be made by warrant 5 the fund. of the department of finance and administration pursuant to 6 7 vouchers signed by the executive director of the commission on Any unexpended or unencumbered balances 8 higher education. 9 remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not 10 revert but shall remain to the credit of the fund."

Section 3. APPROPRIATION. --Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the higher education technology fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2003 and subsequent fiscal years to support the development of a New Mexico virtual college. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund.

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
