AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF GAME AND FISH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Department of Game and Fish Appropriations Act".

Section 2. DEFINITION.--As used in the Department of Game and Fish Appropriations Act, "federal funds" means payments by the United States government to state government or state agencies except those payments made in accordance with the federal Mineral Leasing Act of 1920 and the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972.

Section 3. FORMAT.--The general format of the appropriations set forth in the Department of Game and Fish Appropriations Act with respect to symbols used, column headings and stating of amounts is that used in the General Appropriation Act of 2001.
