16	WHEREAS, more than four thousand diseases of genetic	
17	origin have been identified; and	
18	WHEREAS, many of the diseases associated with genetic	
19	alterations are not diagnostic and only indicate a	
20	predisposition for a disease, such that a person with the	
21	genetic alteration may not necessarily develop the disease;	
22	and	
23	WHEREAS, a person has an estimated five to thirty serious	
24	genetic alterations in his genetic composition representing	
25	less than one-tenth of one percent of his genetic information;	
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and

WHEREAS, genetics is a rapidly evolving field including the identification of new genetic alterations with specific diseases, predisposition for diseases and new applications of genetic information; and

WHEREAS, the use of emerging knowledge may be beneficial to New Mexicans but the potential for misuse is significant; and

9 WHEREAS, the federal Health Insurance Portability and
10 Accountability Act of 1996 prohibits the use of genetic
11 information in health insurance but does not address its use
12 in other types of insurance; and

WHEREAS, appropriate use of genetic counseling, analysis and information may be impeded by the potential for misuse of such information;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the office of the attorney general be requested to convene a task force composed of representatives from the insurance division of the public regulation commission, the workers' compensation administration, the insurance industry, labor, the general public and others as necessary to review, assess and make recommendations regarding:

A. the application of genetic information in employment and workers' compensation matters;

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1 В. the impact of genetic information on the 2 accessibility and affordability of life, long-term care and 3 disability insurance; and other emerging or related uses and misuses of 4 C. genetic information, as appropriate; and 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the assessment and 6 7 formulation of recommendations include consideration of: 8 A. the appropriate scope of the definition of 9 genetic information, including predictive and diagnostic 10 genetic information, genetic test results, history of genetic 11 counseling or testing, family history and inherited 12 characteristics: 13 existing New Mexico and federal law regarding **B**. 14 genetic privacy; 15 the interests of employers, employees, insurers C. 16 and residents of New Mexico: and 17 appropriate legal protections and remedies; and D. 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the office of the attorney 19 general report its findings and recommendations by October 1, 20 2002 to the legislative health and human services committee or 21 an appropriate interim committee; and 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be 23 transmitted to the attorney general, the insurance division of 24 the public regulation commission, the public regulation 25 commission, the workers' compensation administration and the . 139342. 1

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
