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10	A JOINT MEMORIAL
11	REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CONDUCT A STUDY AND
12	PROVIDE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN
13	INTEGRATED APPROACH TO ADDRESS THE NURSING SHORTAGE.
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15	WHEREAS, one hundred twenty-six thousand nurses are
16	needed to fill hospital vacancies nationwide; and
17	WHEREAS, vacancy rates in New Mexico are approximately
18	twenty percent for registered nurses, twelve to fifteen
19	percent for licensed practical nurses and eleven to twenty
20	percent for certified nursing assistants; and
21	WHEREAS, vacancies for nursing positions with the public
22	health division of the department of health exceed one
23	hundred; and
24	WHEREAS, the average age of registered nurses is over
25	forty-three years nationally and over forty-six years in New
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Mexico; and

2	WHEREAS, nurses are critical to the effective delivery of
3	health care in hospitals, home care, hospice care,
4	institutional facilities, clinics and physician offices; and
5	WHEREAS, the aging population and its anticipated
6	increased longevity will place a tremendous demand on the need
7	for nurses;
8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
9	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health be requested
10	to conduct a study that includes:
11	A. an assessment of the financial support required
12	for effective recruitment and retention of nurses for
13	underserved areas;
14	B. identification of incentives for nurses to
15	relocate to underserved areas;
16	C. findings and recommendations on the creation of
17	a center for nursing excellence;
18	D. collection and evaluation of data on the nature
19	of the state's nursing work force;
20	E. a review of the feasibility for multistate or
21	regional nurse licensure;
22	F. recommendations for the development of state-
23	supported education programs to allow rapid realignment of
24	existing programs or development of new programs;
25	G. recommendations on the creation of a nursing
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1	program education development fund to be used as seed money
2	for the rapid development of new programs; and
3	H. recommendations on the appropriate funding
4	levels for faculty positions in all nursing programs,
5	including Ph.D. faculty positions; and
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health
7	report its findings to the legislative health subcommittee or
8	an appropriate interim committee by October 1, 2002; and
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be
10	transmitted to the department of health.
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
