11	RELATING TO FINANCE; CREATING A TASK FORCE FOR FINANCIAL

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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
16	A. The legislature finds that:
17	(1) New Mexico has one of the highest rates of
18	poverty in the country;
19	(2) New Mexico households with low and very
20	low annual income levels have a difficult time obtaining
21	assets;
22	(3) over twenty-four percent of New Mexico
23	children live at or below the poverty level; and
24	(4) New Mexico's poverty rate is eighteen
25	percent, compared to the national average of twelve and
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1 one-half percent.

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2	B. The purpose of this act is to create a task
3	force that will recommend and develop effective strategies to
4	help New Mexicans achieve financial independence.
5	Section 2. TEMPORARY PROVISIONTASK FORCE FOR FINANCIAL
6	I NDEPENDENCE CREATED MEMBERSHI P APPOI NTMENT
7	A. There is created the "task force for financial
8	independence", which shall function from the date of its
9	appointment until December 1, 2004.
10	B. The task force shall be composed of at least
11	fifteen members and be chaired by the lieutenant governor.
12	Additional members shall be appointed by the governor and shall
13	include at least some representatives from the following
14	interests:
15	(1) the New Mexico mortgage finance authority;
16	(2) the New Mexico bankers association;
17	(3) the independent community bankers
18	association of New Mexico;
19	(4) the New Mexico credit union league;
20	(5) the New Mexico community foundation;
21	(6) the state department of public education;
22	(7) the human services department;
23	(8) the economic development department;
24	(9) the New Mexico small business development
25	center;
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1	(10) the labor department;
2	(11) the Hispano chamber of commerce;
3	(12) the bureau of business and economic
4	research at the university of New Mexico;
5	(13) the New Mexico small business investment
6	corporation;
7	(14) the health care industry;
8	(15) legislators serving on the interim
9	economic and rural development and telecommunications
10	committee; and
11	(16) legislators serving on other appropriate
12	legislative committees.
13	C. Each member of the task force shall be paid per
14	diem and mileage as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act
15	for nonsalaried public officers.
16	Section 3. TEMPORARY PROVISIONDUTIES OF THE TASK
17	FORCEThe task force for financial independence shall:
18	A. identify and explore current and proposed
19	strategies to foster financial independence and asset building;
20	B. pursue the strategies identified in Subsection A
21	of this section that will have the greatest impact for
22	financial independence and that are most viable, and formulate
23	and advocate for public policy efforts that are required for
24	implementation;
25	C. develop suggestions consistent with the current
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1 highly restrictive state budget environment; 2 explore asset building and implementation D. 3 strategies for New Mexico in the areas of: 4 (1) asset facilitation; (2) 5 asset incentives; and asset protection, including removing 6 (3) 7 barriers to asset accumulation; 8 Ε. seek private sector funding to assist in 9 preparing task force reports; and 10 collaborate with other state financial F. 11 independence task forces and other relevant national 12 organizations in formatting research in a manner that is 13 compatible with national evaluation methods. 14 - 4 -15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 . 145360. 1

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
