AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW; PROHIBITING INDIVIDUALS CONVICTED OF  
A SEXUALLY VIOLENT CRIME IN ANOTHER STATE FROM MOVING TO AND  
RESIDING IN NEW MEXICO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. INDIVIDUALS CONVICTED OF A SEXUALLY VIOLENT  
CRIME IN ANOTHER STATE--PROHIBITED FROM MOVING TO NEW  
MEXICO. --

A. Individuals who have been convicted of a  
sexually violent crime in another state are prohibited from  
moving to and residing in this state.

B. As used in this section, "sexually violent  
crime" means a criminal offense in another state that is  
equivalent to:

- (1) criminal sexual penetration in the first

1 degree, as provided in Subsection C of Section 30-9-11 NMSA  
2 1978; or

3 (2) criminal sexual penetration in the second  
4 degree, as provided in Subsection D of Section 30-9-11 NMSA  
5 1978.

6 Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. --The effective date of the  
7 provisions of this act is July 1, 2003.
