**A JOINT MEMORIAL**

**REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO HEALTH POLICY COMMISSION TO CONDUCT A  
STUDY ON HEALTH CARE EXPENDITURES AND REFORM OPTIONS.**

**WHEREAS, "health care" encompasses more than coverage,  
access and delivery; it also includes primary and preventive  
care, nutrition and exercise; and**

**WHEREAS, the viability of the health care industry is as  
much a part of economic development as new and higher-paying  
jobs; and**

**WHEREAS, health insurance premiums have risen at a rate  
that outpaces general inflation; and**

**WHEREAS, rising health care costs affect all New Mexicans;  
and**

**WHEREAS, the lack of health insurance coverage for so many  
New Mexicans results in a social and economic burden for the**

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1 affected families, employers, health care providers and the  
2 state of New Mexico; and

3 WHEREAS, increasing numbers of businesses cannot afford to  
4 provide health care coverage for their employees; and

5 WHEREAS, rising health care costs impact the cost of  
6 workers' compensation, automobile and malpractice insurance  
7 premiums; and

8 WHEREAS, as health care costs continue to increase, the  
9 number of uninsured and uncompensated New Mexicans will  
10 continue to rise; and

11 WHEREAS, losses from uncompensated care could be reduced  
12 if insurance were provided to the uninsured; and

13 WHEREAS, the legislature is currently faced with the  
14 dilemma of having to fund a variety of important health  
15 programs, including medicaid, state employee, teacher and  
16 retiree health benefits; public health initiatives; and  
17 prescription drugs, at a time of rising costs and limited  
18 general funds; and

19 WHEREAS, over the years, the legislature and the executive  
20 have established numerous programs to address the issues of  
21 health care cost, coverage and access; and

22 WHEREAS, despite these efforts, the problems of coverage,  
23 access and cost continue to confront New Mexico; and

24 WHEREAS, the continuously increasing cost of health care  
25 and the large numbers of uninsured New Mexicans necessitate the

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1 state considering a wide range of new approaches to addressing  
2 these serious problems; and

3 WHEREAS, there are many options for reducing the number of  
4 uninsured, from coverage through a single program to insurance-  
5 market and employment-based reforms; and

6 WHEREAS, the challenge to policymakers is to select the  
7 option or options that will reduce the number of uninsured and  
8 control rising health care costs; and

9 WHEREAS, the New Mexico health policy commission is the  
10 agency designated to collect and evaluate health data and make  
11 policy recommendations;

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE  
13 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico health policy  
14 commission be requested to conduct a comprehensive study to  
15 determine current and projected health expenditures in New  
16 Mexico that will serve as a base line for proposals for dealing  
17 with expenditures and reform options; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study look at several  
19 alternative health care coverage models and analyze the impact  
20 of these models on health care expenditures and the number of  
21 uninsured; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico health policy  
23 commission be requested to report its findings to the  
24 legislative health and human services committee at its October  
25 2004 meeting; and

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1           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of this memorial be  
2 transmitted to the New Mexico health policy commission.

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
