AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS; PROVIDING FOR AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING
PROGRAMS STATEWIDE FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES ONE THROUGH SIX;
MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of Chapter 22, Article 13 NMSA
1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING PROGRAMS--GRADES ONE
THROUGH SIX.--Every school district shall provide after school
tutoring programs for students in grades one through six. In
offering the programs, a school district may use teachers
employed by the district or may contract with private-sector
teaching programs that employ teachers who have experience in
classroom instruction. The tutoring programs shall teach
reading, language arts and mathematics, and may teach other

1 subjects as determined by the school district."

2 Section 2. APPROPRIATION.--Six million three hundred
3 thousand dollars (\$6,300,000) is appropriated from the general
4 fund to the public education department for expenditure in
5 fiscal year 2006 to distribute to school districts for after
6 school tutoring programs provided for in Section 1 of this act.
7 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
8 fiscal year 2006 shall revert to the general fund.

9 Section 3. APPLICABILITY.--This act applies to the 2005-
10 2006 and subsequent school years.
