AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE; REQUIRING THAT SCHOOL DISTRICT ATTENDANCE POLICIES USE WITHDRAWAL OF STUDENTS PURSUANT TO THE DEFINITION OF MEMBERSHIP IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE ACT ONLY AFTER EXHAUSTING EFFORTS TO KEEP STUDENTS IN EDUCATIONAL SETTINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-8-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 128, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-8-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Public School Finance Act:

A. "ADM" or "MEM" means membership;

B. "membership" means the total enrollment of qualified students on the current roll of a class or school on a specified day. The current roll is established by the

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1 addition of original entries and reentries minus withdrawals.
2 Withdrawals of students, in addition to students formally
3 withdrawn from the public school, include students absent from
4 the public school for as many as ten consecutive school days;
5 provided that withdrawals do not include truants and habitual
6 truants the school district is required to intervene with and
7 keep in an educational setting as provided in Section 22-12-9
8 NMSA 1978;

9 C. "basic program ADM" or "basic program MEM" means
10 the MEM of qualified students but excludes the full-time-
11 equivalent MEM in early childhood education and three- and
12 four-year-old students receiving special education services;

13 D. "cost differential factor" is the numerical
14 expression of the ratio of the cost of a particular segment of
15 the school program to the cost of the basic program in grades
16 four through six;

17 E. "department" or "division" means the public
18 education department;

19 F. "early childhood education ADM" or "early
20 childhood education MEM" means the full-time-equivalent MEM of
21 students attending approved early childhood education programs;

22 G. "full-time-equivalent ADM" or "full-time-
23 equivalent MEM" is that membership calculated by applying to
24 the MEM in an approved public school program the ratio of the
25 number of hours per school day devoted to the program to six

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1 hours or the number of hours per school week devoted to the
2 program to thirty hours;

3 H. "operating budget" means the annual financial
4 plan required to be submitted by a local school board;

5 I. "program cost" is the product of the total
6 number of program units to which a school district is entitled
7 multiplied by the dollar value per program unit established by
8 the legislature;

9 J. "program element" is that component of a public
10 school system to which a cost differential factor is applied to
11 determine the number of program units to which a school
12 district is entitled, including but not limited to MEM, full-
13 time-equivalent MEM, teacher, classroom or public school;

14 K. "program unit" is the product of the program
15 element multiplied by the applicable cost differential factor;

16 L. "public money" or "public funds" means all money
17 from public or private sources received by a local school board
18 or officer or employee of a local school board for public use;

19 M. "qualified student" means a public school
20 student who:

21 (1) has not graduated from high school;

22 (2) is regularly enrolled in one-half or more
23 of the minimum course requirements approved by the department
24 for public school students; and

25 (3) is at least five years of age prior to

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1 12:01 a.m. on September 1 of the school year; or

2 (4) is at least three years of age at any time
3 during the school year and is receiving special education
4 services pursuant to rules of the department; or

5 (5) has not reached [~~his~~] the student's
6 twenty-second birthday on the first day of the school year and
7 is receiving special education services pursuant to rules of
8 the department; and

9 N. "state superintendent" means the secretary of
10 public education or [~~his~~] the secretary's designee."

11 Section 2. Section 22-12-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2004,
12 Chapter 28, Section 1) is amended to read:

13 "22-12-9. UNEXCUSED ABSENCES AND TRUANCY--ATTENDANCE
14 POLICIES.--

15 A. As used in this section and Sections 22-12-7 and
16 22-12-8 NMSA 1978:

17 (1) "habitual truant" means a student who has
18 accumulated the equivalent of ten or more unexcused absences
19 within a school year;

20 (2) "truant" means a student who has
21 accumulated five unexcused absences within any twenty-day
22 period; and

23 (3) "unexcused absence" means an absence from
24 school or a class for which the student does not have an
25 allowable excuse pursuant to the Compulsory School Attendance

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1 Law or rules of the local school board or governing authority
2 of a private school.

3 B. Each school district shall maintain an
4 attendance policy that:

5 (1) provides for early identification of
6 students with unexcused absences, truants and habitual truants
7 and provides intervention strategies that focus on keeping
8 truants in an educational setting and prohibit out-of-school
9 suspension and expulsion as the punishment for truancy; ~~and~~

10 (2) uses withdrawal as provided in Section
11 22-8-2 NMSA 1978 only after exhausting efforts to keep students
12 in educational settings; and

13 ~~(2)~~ (3) requires that class attendance be
14 taken for every instructional day in every public school or
15 school program in the school district.

16 C. School districts shall report truancy and
17 habitual truancy rates to the department in a form and at such
18 times as the department determines and shall document efforts
19 made to keep truants and habitual truants in educational
20 settings."
