SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 765 appropriates \$50.0 from the general fund to the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys for the purpose of conducting a study that analyzes and makes recommendations to the New Mexico Crimes Against Children Task Force and appropriate interim Legislative committees regarding the creation of a statewide tracking system for crimes against children.

Significant Issues

No details of the proposed study have been provided.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$50.0 contained in this bill is a non-recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 200 shall revert to the general fund.
