

1 AN ACT

2 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CAPITAL PROJECTS GENERAL  
3 OBLIGATION BONDS TO MAKE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FOR SENIOR  
4 CITIZEN FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS, FOR HIGHER  
5 EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS AND FOR  
6 PUBLIC LIBRARY ACQUISITIONS; PROVIDING FOR A TAX LEVY FOR  
7 PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL OF, INTEREST ON AND CERTAIN COSTS  
8 RELATED TO THE BONDS; REQUIRING APPROVAL OF THE REGISTERED  
9 VOTERS AT THE 2006 GENERAL ELECTION OF THE STATE; DECLARING  
10 AN EMERGENCY.

11  
12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

13 Section 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the  
14 "2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act".

15 Section 2. PURPOSE.--For the purpose of providing funds  
16 for capital expenditures as authorized in the 2006 Capital  
17 Projects General Obligation Bond Act, general obligation  
18 indebtedness of the state is authorized for the purposes and  
19 in the amounts set forth in Section 10 of that act.

20 Section 3. BOND TERMS.--

21 A. The state board of finance, except as limited  
22 by the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act,  
23 shall determine the terms, covenants and conditions of bonds  
24 issued pursuant to that act, including but not limited to:

25 (1) date or dates of issue, denominations

1 and maturities;

2 (2) principal amounts;

3 (3) rate or rates of interest; and

4 (4) provisions for redemption, including  
5 premiums, registration and refundability, whether the bonds  
6 are issued in one or more series and other covenants relating  
7 to the bonds and the issuance thereof.

8 B. The bonds shall be in such form as the state  
9 board of finance determines with an appropriate series  
10 designation and shall bear interest payable as set forth in  
11 the resolution of the state board of finance.

12 C. Payment of the principal of the bonds shall  
13 begin not more than two years after the date of their  
14 issuance, and the bonds shall mature not later than ten years  
15 after the date of their issuance. Both principal and  
16 interest shall be payable in lawful money of the United  
17 States at the office of the paying agent within or without  
18 the state as the state board of finance may direct.

19 D. The bonds shall be executed with the manual or  
20 facsimile signature of the governor or the state treasurer,  
21 and the seal or a facsimile of the seal of the state shall be  
22 placed on each bond, except for any series of bonds issued in  
23 book entry or similar form without the delivery of physical  
24 securities.

25 E. The bonds shall be issued in accordance with

1 the provisions of the 2006 Capital Projects General  
2 Obligation Bond Act, the Supplemental Public Securities Act  
3 and the Uniform Facsimile Signature of Public Officials Act  
4 and may be issued in accordance with the Public Securities  
5 Short-Term Interest Rate Act.

6 F. The full faith and credit of the state is  
7 pledged for the prompt payment when due of the principal of  
8 and interest on all bonds issued and sold pursuant to the  
9 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act.

10 Section 4. EXPENDITURES.--The proceeds from the sale of  
11 the bonds shall be expended solely for providing money to be  
12 distributed for the purposes and in amounts not to exceed the  
13 amounts set forth in Section 10 of the 2006 Capital Projects  
14 General Obligation Bond Act and to pay expenses incurred  
15 under Section 6 of that act. Any proceeds from the sale of  
16 the bonds that are not required for the purposes set forth in  
17 Sections 6 and 10 of that act shall be used for the purpose  
18 of paying the principal of and interest on the bonds.

19 Section 5. SALE.--The bonds authorized under the 2006  
20 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be sold by  
21 the state board of finance at such time and in such manner  
22 and amounts as the board may elect. The bonds may be sold at  
23 private sale or at public sale, in either case at not less  
24 than par plus accrued interest to the date of delivery. If  
25 sold at public sale, the state board of finance shall publish

1 a notice of the time and place of sale in a newspaper of  
2 general circulation in the state and may also publish the  
3 notice in a recognized financial journal outside the state.  
4 The required publications shall be made once each week for  
5 two consecutive weeks prior to the date fixed for the sale,  
6 the last publication thereof to be at least five days prior  
7 to the date of the sale. The notice shall specify the  
8 amount, denomination, maturity and description of the bonds  
9 to be offered for sale and the place, date and hour at which  
10 the sealed bids shall be received. At the time and place  
11 specified in the notice, the state board of finance shall  
12 open the bids in public and shall award the bonds to the  
13 bidder or bidders offering the best price for the bonds. The  
14 state board of finance may reject any or all bids and  
15 readvertise and may waive any irregularity in a bid. All  
16 bids, except that of the state, shall be accompanied by a  
17 deposit of two percent of the principal amount of the bonds  
18 in a form acceptable to the state board of finance. The  
19 deposit of an unsuccessful bidder shall be returned upon  
20 rejection of the bid. The state board of finance may also  
21 sell the bonds or any part of the bonds to the state  
22 treasurer or state investment officer. The state treasurer  
23 or state investment officer is authorized to purchase any of  
24 the bonds for investment. The bonds are legal investments  
25 for any person or board charged with the investment of any

1 public funds and may be accepted as security for any deposit  
2 of public money.

3 Section 6. EXPENSES.--The expenses incurred by the  
4 state board of finance in or relating to the preparation and  
5 sale of the bonds shall be paid out of the proceeds from the  
6 sale of the bonds, and all rebate, penalty, interest and  
7 other obligations of the state relating to the bonds and bond  
8 proceeds under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended,  
9 shall be paid from earnings on bond proceeds or other money  
10 of the state, legally available for such payments.

11 Section 7. TAX LEVY.--To provide for the payment of the  
12 principal of and interest on the bonds issued and sold  
13 pursuant to the provisions of the 2006 Capital Projects  
14 General Obligation Bond Act, there shall be and there is  
15 hereby imposed and levied during each year in which any of  
16 the bonds are outstanding an ad valorem tax on all property  
17 in the state subject to property taxation for state purposes  
18 sufficient to pay the interest as it becomes due on the  
19 bonds, together with an amount sufficient to provide a  
20 sinking fund to pay the principal of the bonds as it becomes  
21 due and, if permitted by law, ad valorem taxes may be  
22 collected to pay administrative costs incident to the  
23 collection of such taxes. The taxes shall be imposed,  
24 levied, assessed and collected at the times and in the manner  
25 that other property taxes for state purposes are imposed,

1 levied, assessed and collected. It is the duty of all tax  
2 officials and authorities to cause these taxes to be imposed,  
3 levied, assessed and collected.

4 Section 8. TREASURER--DUTIES.--The state treasurer  
5 shall keep separate accounts of all money collected pursuant  
6 to the taxes imposed and levied pursuant to the provisions of  
7 the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act and  
8 shall use this money only for the purposes of paying the  
9 principal of and interest on the bonds as they become due and  
10 any expenses relating thereto.

11 Section 9. IRREPEALABLE CONTRACT--AUTHORITY FOR  
12 ISSUANCE.--An owner of bonds issued pursuant to the  
13 provisions of the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation  
14 Bond Act may, either at law or in equity, by suit, action or  
15 mandamus, enforce and compel the performance of the duties  
16 required by that act of any officer or entity mentioned in  
17 that act. The provisions of that act constitute an  
18 irrevocable contract with the owners of any of the bonds  
19 issued pursuant to that act for the faithful performance of  
20 which the full faith and credit of the state is pledged.  
21 Without reference to any other act of the legislature, the  
22 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is full  
23 authority for the issuance and sale of the bonds authorized  
24 in that act, and such bonds shall have all the qualities of  
25 investment securities under the Uniform Commercial Code,

1 shall not be invalid for any irregularity or defect in the  
2 proceedings for the issuance and sale of the bonds and shall  
3 be incontestable in the hands of bona fide purchasers or  
4 holders thereof for value. All bonds issued under the  
5 provisions of that act, and the interest thereon, are exempt  
6 from taxation by the state and any subdivision or public body  
7 thereof.

8 Section 10. PROJECTS.--The proceeds from the sale of  
9 bonds issued under the provisions of the 2006 Capital  
10 Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be distributed as  
11 follows for the purposes and in the amounts specified:

12 A. for senior citizen facility improvements and  
13 construction, to the aging and long-term services department:

14 (1) forty-nine thousand three hundred eighty  
15 dollars (\$49,380) to purchase and install meals equipment for  
16 senior centers citywide in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

17 (2) three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to  
18 plan, design, construct and equip a centralized kitchen for  
19 comprehensive and coordinated services for senior centers in  
20 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

21 (3) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000)  
22 to make improvements, including purchase and installation of  
23 equipment, to the Armijo senior center in Bernalillo county;

24 (4) twenty-two thousand five hundred  
25 forty-two dollars (\$22,542) to make improvements, including

1 purchase and installation of equipment, to the Armijo senior  
2 meal site in Bernalillo county;

3 (5) one hundred forty thousand dollars  
4 (\$140,000) to make improvements, including purchase and  
5 installation of equipment, to the Barelmas senior center in  
6 Bernalillo county;

7 (6) one hundred twenty thousand dollars  
8 (\$120,000) to purchase and install equipment for the Barelmas  
9 and Highland senior centers in Bernalillo county;

10 (7) forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to make  
11 improvements, including purchase and installation of  
12 equipment, to the Highland senior center in Bernalillo  
13 county;

14 (8) forty-two thousand dollars (\$42,000) to  
15 make improvements, including purchase and installation of  
16 equipment, to the Pueblo of Isleta senior center in  
17 Bernalillo county;

18 (9) eighteen thousand sixty-six dollars  
19 (\$18,066) to make improvements, including purchase and  
20 installation of equipment, to Los Vecinos senior meal site in  
21 Bernalillo county;

22 (10) one hundred fifty thousand dollars  
23 (\$150,000) to make improvements, including purchase and  
24 installation of equipment, to the North Valley senior center  
25 in Bernalillo county;

1 (11) five thousand nine hundred fifty  
2 dollars (\$5,950) to make improvements, including purchase and  
3 installation of equipment, to the Pajarito senior meal site  
4 in Bernalillo county;

5 (12) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000)  
6 to make improvements, including purchase and installation of  
7 equipment, to the Palo Duro senior center in Bernalillo  
8 county;

9 (13) seventeen thousand six hundred  
10 thirty-two dollars (\$17,632) to make improvements, including  
11 purchase and installation of equipment, to the Paradise Hills  
12 senior meal site in Bernalillo county;

13 (14) fifteen thousand three hundred

8 (19) sixty-four thousand two hundred

10 equipment for the senior olympics program in Chaves county;

11 (20) five hundred thousand dollars  
12 (\$500,000) to plan, design, construct and equip a new  
13 facility to accommodate seniors for the Hagerman and Dexter  
14 Joy center in Chaves county;

15 (21) four thousand eighty-nine dollars  
16 (\$4,089) to make improvements, including purchase and

15 C. Each question set forth in this section  
16 includes a specific work or object to be financed by the

21 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act. The

17 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the  
18 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes  
19 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be  
20 made for purposes other than those specified in the  
21 appropriation.

22 B. The state agencies and state institutions to  
23 which money has been appropriated in the 2006 Capital  
24 Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be responsible for  
25 monitoring the projects funded in that act to ensure

1 compliance with the constitution and laws of New Mexico, and  
2 shall cause to be reverted any unexpended or unencumbered  
3 balance remaining at the earlier of the third full fiscal  
4 year after issuance of the bonds or the termination or  
5 completion of the specific project. Reverted funds shall be  
6 deposited in the debt service fund established by the state  
7 treasurer for the purpose of paying the principal of and  
8 interest on the state's general obligation bonds.

9 Section 14. SEVERABILITY.--If any part or application  
10 of the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is  
11 held invalid, the remainder or its application to other  
12 situations or persons shall not be affected.

13 Section 15. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public  
14 peace, health and safety that this act take effect  
15 immediately.

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
