16	WHEREAS, providing the clients of substance abuse
17	treatment programs with gender-specific treatments has resulted
18	in longer and more successful treatments; and
19	WHEREAS, the tendency of women to leave treatment earlier
20	than men has been attributed to the inability of treatment
21	programs to meet their complex medical, social and emotional
22	needs; and
23	WHEREAS, effective substance abuse treatment for women
24	helps halt a downward spiral that, if left unchecked, may
25	result in increased criminal activity; and

WHEREAS, such programs are fundamental to public safety, preventing crime and protecting potential victims of crime; and

WHEREAS, substance abuse treatment programs for women with children that address women's unique needs, including their relationships with their partners, families and children and any history of physical and sexual abuse, are more effective than traditional programs and have the additional benefit of assisting the children of those women; and

WHEREAS, there is no gender-specific long-term 10 transitional housing program for women and their children that 11 serves the state of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the unique substance abuse treatment needs of women include child care services, women-only treatment and prenatal care; and

WHEREAS, limited access to child care services is one of the most frequently cited barriers to treatment of women seeking treatment, and programs that allow women to bring their children into residential treatment experience greater lengths of stay; and

WHEREAS, the children of addicted parents have the highest risk of abusing alcohol and drugs due to both genetic and environmental factors; and

WHEREAS, a strong correlation has been documented between parental addiction and child abuse and neglect; and

WHEREAS, the children of addicted parents are at higher .171004.2 - 2 -

risk for being abandoned at birth, being placed in foster care, running away from home and becoming homeless; and

WHEREAS, the children of addicted parents experience physical and mental health problems at a greater rate than children of non-addicted parents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that Bernalillo county be encouraged to develop a transitional housing and substance abuse treatment program for women with children that will address their unique needs and create a positive living environment during the rehabilitation process; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the children, youth and families department, the human services department and the department of health consider joining Bernalillo county in the identification of sources for funding for and the development and ultimate implementation of such a program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the county manager of Bernalillo county and to the secretaries of children, youth and families; human services; and health.
