Bill Summary:

SJM 52 resolves that:

- the Public Education Department (PED), in collaboration with the Higher Education
 Department, school district and charter school leaders, the faculty of the colleges of
 education, professional development providers, and national board certified teachers,
 explore options to support more teachers in achieving certification by the National
 Board for Professional Teaching Standards;
- PED and its "study partners" consider options for incentives to encourage board certified teachers to teach in underperforming schools; and
- PED report its findings and recommendations to the Legislative Education Study Committee by November 15, 2010.

Fiscal Impact:

Legislative memorials do not contain an appropriation.

Fiscal Issues:

Memorials requesting that state agencies research issues and make reports are likely to have a fiscal impact in terms of staff time, travel, office supplies, and other items. This impact could be especially pronounced if the agencies are experiencing budget reductions or staff furloughs.

Technical Issues:

Although SJM 52 implies that PED conduct a study in collaboration with its "study partners," there is no actual language in the memorial requesting that a study be done.
