C. recommend changes in these laws if any are deemed desirable and draft and present to the legislature any legislation necessary;

D. prepare a comparison of tribal versus nontribal
cuts or reversions to capital outlay projects or funds by
county, including the dollar amounts of the cuts or reversions
compared to total county population, and report on the equity
of cuts or reversions to the senate finance committee in
advance of its issuance of a committee report on a bill to
revert or cut tribal capital outlay; and

[Đ.] <u>E.</u> make a full report of its findings and recommendations for the consideration of each successive legislature following its original establishment, the report and suggested legislation to be available to each member of the legislature on or before the first day of the regular session [thereof]."

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
