1 A MEMORIAL 2 URGING THE GOVERNOR TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY IN NORTHWESTERN 3 NEW MEXICO WHERE SNOWSTORMS THREATEN SURVIVAL. 4 5 WHEREAS, northwestern New Mexico has been devastated by at least three snowstorms, one after another, in recent 6 7 weeks; and WHEREAS, in some places on the Navajo Nation, snow is at 8 a depth of four feet; and 9 WHEREAS, such deep snow, especially when layered upon 10 sheets of ice, is treacherous not only because it is 11 difficult to walk through but also because it can cause 12 13 disorientation; and WHEREAS, such deep snow forces isolation on people who 14 15 live in remote corners of the Navajo Nation as well as those who may live closer to roads; and 16 WHEREAS, residents isolated by the snow are likely to 17 have inadequate food and water supplies; and 18 WHEREAS, these isolated New Mexicans may be unable to 19 20 survive another storm or weather the long period when roads remain impassable as the snow melts; and 21 WHEREAS, even the livestock of people isolated by the 22 storms may be unable to find food and water under snow so 23

deep it is up to their bellies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE

STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the governor be urged to declare an emergency immediately for areas in northwestern New Mexico where roads are impassable, animals cannot reach food and water and where residents are unable to get to sources of food, water and medical care; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the governor be requested to announce his funding decision as soon as possible so that persons snowed under may hear whether they will have to dig out from the snow without state government help; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the governor and the secretary of homeland security and emergency management.______ SM 41
