### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 212 amends the Concealed Handgun Carry Act of 2003 [29-19-6(H) NMSA 1978] Appeal; license renewal; refresher firearms training course; suspension or revocation of license. SB 212 eliminates the requirement that a concealed handgun carry licensee complete a two-hour refresher firearms training course two years after the issuance of an original or renewed license.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications to the state.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

DPS reports that a two-hour firearms refresher course would not significantly enhance one's ability to safely manipulate a handgun.

An internet review of concealed carry statutes of our neighboring states Arizona, Oklahoma, and Texas found that none required an additional training course for permit renewal.
