Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 254 amends the Criminal Offender Employment Act to restrict the inquiry and consideration of a conviction until the final stages of the hiring process.

This bill provides that a board, department, or agency of the state shall not make an inquiry regarding a conviction on an initial application for employment. A conviction shall not be taken into consideration until the applicant is selected as a finalist for the position.
