| 18 | BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:        |
| 19 | Section l. It is proposed to amend Article 7, Section l              |
| 20 | of the constitution of New Mexico to read:                           |
| 21 | "[ <del>Every citizen of the United States who is over the age</del> |
| 22 | of twenty-one years and has resided in New Mexico twelve             |
| 23 | months, in the county ninety days, and in the precinct in which      |
| 24 | he offers to vote thirty days, next preceding the election,          |
| 25 | except idiots, insane persons and persons convicted of a             |

felonious or infamous crime unless restored to political 1 rights, shall be qualified to vote at all elections for public 2 officers.] Every person who is a qualified elector pursuant to 3 the constitution and laws of the United States and a citizen 4 thereof shall be qualified to vote in all elections in New 5 Mexico, subject to residency and registration requirements 6 7 provided by law, except as restricted by statute either by reason of criminal conviction for a felony or by reason of 8 9 mental incapacity, being limited only to those persons who are 10 unable to mark their ballot and who are concurrently also unable to communicate their voting preference. The legislature 11 12 may enact laws providing for absentee voting by qualified electors. All school elections shall be held at different 13 times from other elections. 14

The legislature shall have the power to require the registration of the qualified electors as a requisite for voting and shall regulate the manner, time and places of voting. The legislature shall enact such laws as will secure the secrecy of the ballot <u>and</u> the purity of elections and guard against the abuse of elective franchise. Not more than two members of the board of registration and not more than two judges of election shall belong to the same political party at the time of their appointment."

Section 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or .180605.1
