#### **AS AMENDED**

#### The Senate Finance Committee amendments:

- strike the House Taxation and Revenue Committee amendment that added authorization for several more projects, including two school districts and one institution of higher education; and
- add authorization for several additional projects, including three school districts, three charter schools, the New Mexico Military Institute, and two institutions of higher education (see Attachment).

#### The House Taxation and Revenue Committee amendments:

- change the authorization of a project for the Las Vegas school district to the "West" Las Vegas school district;
- delete the authorization of a project for the New Mexico Highlands University Foundation; and
- add authorization for several more projects, including projects in two more school districts and one more institution of higher education (see Attachment).

## **Original Bill Summary:**

HB 53 authorizes the New Mexico Finance Authority (NMFA) to make loans from the Public Project Revolving Fund to 130 entities, including 29 school districts and three institutions of higher education (see Attachment).

# **Fiscal Impact:**

HB 53 does not contain an appropriation.

## **Substantive Issues:**

According to current law, the *New Mexico Finance Authority Act* creates the Public Project Revolving Fund, which is administered by NMFA. The fund consists of principal of and interest on loans and securities held by NMFA, as well as any other dollars appropriated, distributed, or otherwise allocated to the fund for the purpose of financing public projects specifically authorized by law.

The act provides that loans of \$1.0 million or less do not require authorization by law.

A related bill, CS/SB 48, *Change NMFA Public Project Fund Requirements*, temporarily removes the requirement that projects be authorized by law (from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2013), but requires NMFA to report quarterly to the Legislature and the NMFA Oversight Committee<sup>1</sup> on public projects approved by NMFA and the status of the Public Project Revolving Fund.
