Bill Summary:

According to HM 11, The *EcoArt America Challenge* is a collaborative project for seventh and eighth grade students in the Albuquerque and Santa Fe public schools in which the students envision, design and create imaginative, large-scale works of art using recycled materials and found objects.

HM 11 requests the Cultural Affairs Department, the Public Education Department, the superintendents of the Albuquerque and Santa Fe public school districts and Artworks America to collaborate to implement the *EcoArt America Challenge* in middle schools in those communities and to encourage other districts and business partners statewide to participate in the project.
