16	SECTION 1. Section 40-1-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1862-
17	1863, p.64, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"40-1-4. <u>FOREIGN MARRIAGES RECOGNIZED</u> [Sec. 5.]
19	A. Except as provided in Subsection B of this
20	section, all marriages celebrated beyond the limits of this
21	state [which] <u>that</u> are valid according to the laws of the <u>state</u>
22	<u>or</u> country [wherein] <u>in which</u> they were celebrated or
23	contracted shall be [likewise] valid in this state and shall
24	have the same force as if they had been celebrated in
25	accordance with the laws in force in this state.

1	<u>B. A marriage, civil union or similar relationship</u>
2	entered into by persons of the same sex, either pursuant to
3	statute or common law, that is recognized by another state or
4	country, is void and not recognized for any purpose in this
5	state, and contractual or other rights granted by virtue of
6	such marriage, civil union or similar relationship, including
7	its termination, are unenforceable in this state.
8	C. The legislature finds that in the exercise of
9	the state's police power and recognizing the state's strong
10	interest in governing the relationships between married
11	persons, the provisions of Subsection B of this section shall
12	apply retroactively."
13	SECTION 2. SEVERABILITYIf any part or application of
14	the provisions of this act is held invalid, the remainder or
15	its application to other situations or persons shall not be
16	affected.
17	SECTION 3. APPLICABILITYThe provisions of this act
18	shall apply retroactively.
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
