15	SECTION 1. Section 22-2-8.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986,
16	Chapter 33, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

19	A. For the 2011-2012 school year, a school year
20	consists of at least one hundred eighty full instructional days
21	for a regular school year calendar, exclusive of any release
22	time for in-service training. [A school year consists of at
23	least one hundred fifty full instructional days for a variable
24	school year calendar, exclusive of any release time for in-

1 this section, days or parts of days that are lost to weather, 2 in-service training or other events that are not school-3 directed programs shall be made up so that students are given a full instructional school year. 4 5 Β. Except as otherwise provided in this section, regular students shall be in school-directed programs, 6 exclusive of lunch, for a minimum of the following: 7 8 (1) kindergarten, for half-day programs, two 9 and one-half hours per day or, for full-day programs, five and one-half hours per day; 10 (2) grades one through six, five and one-half 11 12 hours per day; and grades seven through twelve, six hours per 13 (3) 14 day. C. Beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, a 15 regular school year consists of at least two hundred full 16 instructional days in four quarters of ten five-day weeks 17 provided throughout the entire calendar year. Days or parts of 18 days that are lost to weather, in-service training or other 19 20 events that are not school-directed programs shall be made up so that students are given a full instructional school year. 21 Regular students shall be in school-directed programs, 22 exclusive of lunch or any release time for in-service training, 23 for a minimum of the following during the school year: 24 (1) kindergarten, for half-day programs, two 25

1 and one-half hours per day, or, for full-day programs, five and 2 one-half hours per day; (2) grades one through six, five and one-half 3 hours per day; and 4 (3) grades seven through twelve, six hours per 5 day. 6 7 [G.] D. The department shall provide for the length and number of school days for schools on a four-day week and, 8 9 for school year 2011-2012, for variable school year calendars in accordance with the Variable School Calendar Act. 10 [D.] E. Up to thirty-three hours of the full-day 11 12 kindergarten program may be used for home visits by the teacher or for parent-teacher conferences. Up to twenty-two hours of 13 14 grades one through six programs may be used for home visits by the teacher or for parent-teacher conferences. Up to twelve 15 hours of grades seven through twelve programs may be used to 16 consult with parents to develop next step plans for students 17 and for parent-teacher conferences. 18 19 $[\underline{E_{\cdot}}]$ <u>F</u>. Nothing in this section precludes a local 20 school board from setting a school year or the length of school days in excess of the minimum requirements established by 21 Subsections A [and B] through C of this section. 22 [F.] G. The secretary may waive the minimum length 23 or number of school days in those school districts where such 24 minimums would create undue hardships as defined by the 25 .184624.1
