| 20 | "66-5-60. COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSEQUALIFICATIONS |

| 22 | A. The division shall not issue a commercial |
| 23 | driver's license to a person unless that person can establish |
| 24 | that New Mexico is the person's state of domicile and has |
| 25 | passed a knowledge and skills test for driving a commercial |
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1 motor vehicle and, for related endorsements, has passed a
2 medical fitness test and has satisfied any other requirements
3 of the New Mexico Commercial Driver's License Act. <u>The</u>
4 division shall adopt rules to facilitate Native Americans
5 domiciled on a reservation without a physical address to
6 establish New Mexico as the state of domicile.

B. The division may authorize a person, including an agency of this or another state, an employer, a private driver-training facility or other private institution or a department, agency or instrumentality of local government to administer the skills test specified by this section.

[C. A commercial driver's license applicant shall not take a test specified in this section more than three times within one year.

 $\overline{D_{r}}$] <u>C.</u> If the department determines that a commercial driver's license applicant has committed an offense in taking a test specified in this section, the division shall not issue a commercial driver's license to that applicant within one year of the department's determination."

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2011.

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
