7	SECTION 1. A new section of the Food Service Sanitation		
8	Act is enacted to read:		
9	"PET DOGS IN OUTDOOR DINING AREASREQUIREMENTS		
10	A. A food service establishment may allow pet dogs		
11	in designated outdoor dining areas of the establishment if		
12	the following requirements are met:		
13	(1) no pet dog shall be allowed in any area		
14	where food is prepared;		
15	(2) patrons shall keep their pet dogs on a		
16	leash at all times and keep their pet dogs under reasonable		
17	control;		
18	(3) pet dogs shall not be allowed on chairs,		
19	tables or other furnishings; and		
20	(4) a sign or signs shall be posted to place		
21	the public on notice that the designated outdoor dining area		
22	is available for the use of patrons with pet dogs. Signs		
23	shall be at a minimum eight and one-half inches by eleven		
24	inches in size and use type that is uniform in size and no		
25	smaller than necessary to fill the sign to within two inches	SB Pag	

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1 of the borders. The signs shall contain language reasonably 2 designed to inform the public that dogs are permitted and may 3 be present. Signs shall be posted prominently and be easily visible in both the area where dogs are permitted and at the 4 5 entrance of the establishment. The board shall promulgate by 6 rule the specific language to be included in the signs pursuant to Section 74-1-9 NMSA 1978. 7 8 B. Employees shall: wash their hands immediately after 9 (1) touching, petting or otherwise handling pet dogs; and 10 (2) immediately clean up accidents involving 11 pet waste and sanitize the area. 12 A food service establishment may in its 13 C. discretion prohibit pet dogs in outdoor dining areas. If a 14 15 food service establishment allows pet dogs in a designated outdoor dining area, the food service establishment shall 16 have the right to refuse to serve the owner of a pet dog if 17 the owner fails to exercise reasonable control over the pet 18 dog or the pet dog is otherwise behaving in a manner that 19 20 compromises or threatens to compromise the health or safety of any person present in the restaurant." 21 SECTION 2. Section 25-1-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1977, 22 Chapter 309, Section 4) is amended to read: 23 "25-1-4. BOARD--POWERS AND DUTIES.--The board shall 24 promulgate procedural and substantive regulations consistent 25 SB 11

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with the provisions of Section 74-1-9 NMSA 1978 and shall include provisions for:

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3 A. requiring food service establishments to prepare and serve food in a manner safe for human 4 5 consumption, free from adulteration, spoilage, contamination 6 and unwholesomeness, and, to accomplish this standard, the following areas of food service establishment operations 7 8 shall be covered by the regulations: 9 (1) disease control; 10 (2) employee hygiene and sanitation; 11 (3) food service establishment premises sanitation; 12 (4) all aspects of food service 13 establishment construction relating to food service 14 15 sanitation, including requirements for food service establishment construction plans and specifications review 16 and approval by the division; 17 control of pests and infestation by (5) 18 19 pests; 20 (6) lavatory and toilet facility placement and sanitation; 21 (7) lavatory hygiene; 22 (8) food equipment and utensil design and 23 construction; 24 food equipment and utensil storage and (9) 25 SB 11 Page 3

1 handling; 2 liquid and solid waste disposal; (10)3 (11) food and drink preparation, handling, display and storage; 4 food service establishment ventilation; 5 (12) 6 (13) water supply; itinerant food service establishment 7 (14)8 construction and operation; and any other facet of food service 9 (15)10 operations that reasonably may be considered to pose an 11 existing or potential hazard to the health of the consuming public; provided that no regulation shall prohibit food 12 service establishments from allowing pet dogs in designated 13 outdoor dining areas; 14 15 Β. the issuance, suspension and revocation of permits required under the Food Service Sanitation Act, which 16 regulations shall provide for prior notice to and a hearing 17 for any applicant for or holder of a permit when the 18 division-proposed action is to deny an application for or 19 20 suspend or revoke a permit, except in those specified instances under the provisions of the Food Service Sanitation 21 Act when the division is authorized to take any of the 22 foregoing actions without prior notice and hearing; and 23 C. establishing requirements for inspections of 24 25 food service establishments, which shall include provisions
