14	who furnishes evidence satisfactory to the board that the	
15	applicant:	
16	(1) has reached the age of majority;	
17	(2) is of good moral character;	
18	(3) is not in violation of any of the	
19	provisions of the Professional Psychologist Act and the rules	
20	adopted pursuant to that act;	
21	(4) is a graduate of:	
22	(a) a doctoral program that is	
23	designated as a doctoral program in psychology by a	
24	nationally recognized designation system or that is

holds a degree with a major in clinical, counseling or school
 psychology from a university offering a full-time course of
 study in psychology; or

(b) a doctoral program outside the 4 5 United States or Canada that is equivalent to a program in Subparagraph (a) of this paragraph and holds a degree with a 6 major in clinical, counseling or school psychology from a 7 8 university offering a full-time course of study in psychology; the board shall promulgate by rule a list of 9 10 board-approved credential inspection and verification services to appraise foreign degree programs; 11

12 (5) has had at least two years of supervised 13 experience in psychological work of a type satisfactory to 14 the board; provided that:

(a) up to one year of the supervised
experience may be obtained in predoctoral practicum hours
overseen by a graduate training program and consistent with
the guidelines on practicum experience for licensure
promulgated by the association of state and provincial
psychology boards;

(b) up to one year of the supervised experience may be obtained in a predoctoral internship approved by the American psychological association; (c) up to one-half year of the supervised experience may be obtained in a predoctoral

 association; and

(d) any portion of the required
 supervised experience not satisfied pursuant to Subparagraphs
 (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph shall be obtained in
 postdoctoral psychological work;

demonstrates professional competence by 7 (6) 8 passing the examination for professional practice in psychology promulgated by the association of state and 9 10 provincial psychology boards with a total raw score of 140 (seventy percent), before January 1, 1993 or, if after 11 January 1, 1993, a score equal to or greater than the passing 12 score recommended by the association of state and provincial 13 psychology boards; 14

(7) demonstrates an awareness and knowledge of New Mexico cultures as determined by the board; and

17 (8) passes such jurisprudence examination as
18 may be given by the board through an online testing and
19 scoring mechanism.

B. Upon investigation of the application and other
evidence submitted, including a criminal background check,
the board shall, not less than thirty days prior to the
examination, notify each applicant that the application and
evidence submitted for licensure are satisfactory and
accepted or unsatisfactory and rejected. If rejected, the SB 377

1 notice shall state the reasons for rejection.

C. The place of examination shall be designated in
advance by the board, and examinations shall be given at such
time and place and under such supervision as the board may
determine.

D. In the event an applicant fails to receive a
passing grade, the applicant may apply for reexamination and
shall be allowed to take a subsequent examination upon
payment of the fee required by the Professional Psychologist
Act.

E. The board shall keep a record of all examinations, and the grade assigned to each, as part of its records for at least two years subsequent to the date of examination."
