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5	WHEREAS, home inspection is an important part of a	
6	residential real estate transaction and provides consumers	
7	with a description of the condition of the house being	
8	purchased; and	
9	WHEREAS, New Mexico is one of only sixteen states in the	
10	United States that does not license home inspectors; and	
11	WHEREAS, there are no minimum training, experience or	
12	continuing education requirements for a person to engage in	
13	the business of home inspection; and	
14	WHEREAS, the New Mexico real estate commission receives	
15	a large number of property condition complaints annually, and	
16	often the complaints become a source of costly litigation;	
17	and	
18	WHEREAS, consumers deserve the same degree of protection	
19	for home inspection issues that exists for virtually all	
20	other aspects of a residential real estate transaction; and	
21	WHEREAS, the regulation and licensing department, the	
22	New Mexico real estate commission and the REALTORS	
23	association of New Mexico have engaged in informal	
24	discussions regarding the need and proper enforcement	
25	mechanism for state licensing of home inspectors; and	SM Pa
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SM 2 Page l WHEREAS, these organizations agree that further study is necessary before legislation relating to licensing of home inspectors is introduced in order to ensure that the chosen approach is cost-effective and does not impose undue regulatory burdens on consumers and professionals; and

WHEREAS, the senate would be well served by having these organizations study legislation relating to licensing of home inspectors;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that representatives from the regulation and licensing department, the New Mexico real estate commission and the REALTORS association of New Mexico be requested to form a working group to study legislation providing for home inspector licensing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group present its findings and recommendations for proposed legislation to the interim legislative Mortgage Finance Authority Act oversight committee by no later than November 15, 2011; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the regulation and licensing department, the New Mexico real estate commission and the REALTORS association of New Mexico.

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
