A MEMORIAL

DECLARING FEBRUARY 15, 2011 AS "ADULT BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY DAY" IN THE SENATE.

WHEREAS, in a future that is anticipated to be increasingly dependent on technology, New Mexico will need a highly literate population; and

WHEREAS, more than forty percent of the adults in

New Mexico have a literacy problem that severely impacts

their lives and families, their ability to work productively
and their full participation as residents of the state; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico's community colleges and universities and its volunteer and community-based organizations provided basic skills and literacy services to more than thirty-two thousand adults between 2009 and 2010, including providing one million seven hundred thousand hours of instruction; and

WHEREAS, two thousand six hundred ninety-one individuals received their GED high school equivalency diplomas, more than one thousand individuals enrolled in post-secondary education or training and two thousand three hundred six individuals entered or retained employment between 2009 and 2010; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico higher education department, the New Mexico coalition for literacy and numerous adult basic
