## **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 163 amends Section 1-8-2 NMSA 1978 of Election Code. This legislation adds language to the statute allowing an individual signing a nominating petition to provide a mailing address if he or she does not possess a residential address. This measure is aimed at making the statute uniform with the provision allowing this practice in Section 1-8-31.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This bill compliments Section 1-4-5.3 NMSA 1978 of the Election Code as it provides for the determination of "residence." Because of the methods of determining residence, which include the provision of a mailing address along with a map or the longitude and latitude indicating where an individual resides, there may not be a physical address available. Therefore, this would add consistency within the Election Code.
