## **SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis of Bill

The House Judiciary Committee substitute to House Bill 275 raises the population limit for a magistrate district (Section 35-1-2) to 250,000 to harmonize with Section 34-8A-1.

The bill eliminates the requirement in Section 35-2-1 that magistrates in counties with a population of 200,000 be attorneys.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be a minimal administrative cost for statewide update, distribution and documentation of statutory changes.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to the AOC, there seems to be no policy reason why a county with a 199,000 population would not require an attorney judge in a limited jurisdiction court but a county with 200,000 population would.

This bill would harmonize the magistrate and metropolitan court statutes. Section 34-8A-1

requires a metropolitan court in counties of 250,000 or more. Metropolitan court judges are required to be attorneys in Section 34-8A-4. If this change is amended counties over 250,000 would have attorney judges and metropolitan courts, but no other magistrate court would require attorney judges.
